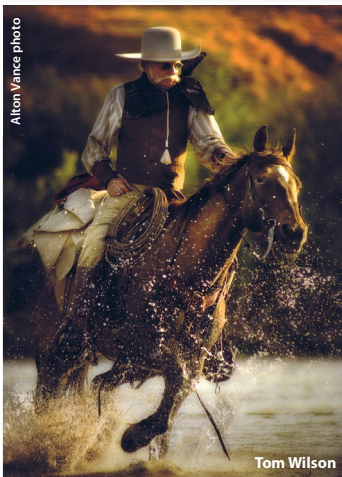


What New Year's resolution do YOU have with your horses for 2015?
